

The story of Ukraine Charity begins in 2007, when a small group of Ukrainian professionals from London visited an orphanage in Lviv, western Ukraine. It was almost Christmas, and the cold winter was setting in. They saw that the orphanage was in dire need of repairs and lacking even the most basic supplies, leaving the children without proper means to learn and play.

Greatly affected by what they saw, on their return to London, the group told their friends and colleagues about the struggling orphanage. A collection was started, and tediously, through small cash donations, funds were raised and physically taken to Ukraine, where local builders were employed to renovate the orphanage. The staff and the children were delighted with the results.

The fundraisers, however, realized that with organization, creativity and hard work, more effective fundraising could be set up for future projects. With some pro bono legal help and

strategy brainstorming, Ukraine Charity was conceived, and the rest is history.

The idea of Ukraine Charity was simple — to enable and facilitate fundraising for those based in the United Kingdom and willing to help people in need in Ukraine, particularly children.

Before the charity was established, many of our donors supported projects in Ukraine on an ad hoc basis. Ukraine Charity brought these efforts of many kind-hearted people under one roof, facilitated idea sharing and made the fundraising and project implementation streamlined and efficient.

From the beginning, Ukraine Charity has been run entirely by volunteers, through late-night coffee shop get-togethers, emails and phone calls. We have no staff or office space, and we pride ourselves on our volunteer culture, which allows the full positive impact of the funds we raise to be felt by those in Ukraine who need our help most.



Since 24 February 2022, life has been forever changed for Ukraine and its people. The Ukraine Charity team is no exception. Like all Ukrainians, each member of our team will never forget the early hours of that day, being awoken by the most awful news, and an overwhelming number of phone calls and missed calls from family and friends.

Despite facing personal challenges brought on by the full-scale Russian invasion, as a charity focused on providing help to Ukraine since 2007, we were in a privileged position to assist our home country on a greater scale and more efficiently, utilizing our knowledge, experience, and well-developed network of trusted partners over the last 15 years.

The past year has been intense, with very little time for reflection or strategy. We had to focus on actively helping where we could. The charity has witnessed a remarkable increase in donations and support, attributed to the ongoing war and humanitarian crisis in Ukraine. Over this period, more than GBP 2.3 million has been raised, out of which GBP 2.15 million has been donated towards projects in Ukraine providing war crisis relief. Our administrative expenses remain very low, with only £21K spent on such expenses since February 2022. From the very beginning, Ukraine Charity has been supporting underprivileged children and providing assistance to disadvantaged families in Ukraine. However, last year we shifted our focus, with 80% of funds going towards providing emergency medical and humanitarian aid to hospitals, and the rest towards children and communities affected by the crisis. In total, we have sponsored more than 50 projects and worked with more than 60 incredible partners. Together, we have purchased thousands of tourniquets and medicines, dozens of ambulances, equipped mobile medical cabinets, supplied evacuation cars, organized medical

trainings, provided food and essential supplies, built shelters and sports grounds for children, supported the children's Paralympic team, built a sensory room for children with special needs, supported mental health programs, and much more.

Along the way, we have received a lot of corporate support and generosity. Ukraine Charity is honoured to have become a pro bono client of a leading international law firm, Covington, which helps us to implement best practice compliance policies and procedures. We also received a kind donation from Oracle and are currently implementing the NetSuite ERP system for charities' administration and financial reporting, which aims to improve the efficiency of our internal operations.

Our dedicated core team of seven people and volunteers would like to express our gratitude for the generous support and trust received from donors, supporters, partners, businesses, and the British people. It is thanks to you that Ukraine Charity has been able to contribute greatly and help those in need during the fight for the freedom of Ukraine. We are grateful for the numerous private and team fundraising initiatives, challenges, and for showing your support by joining our fundraising event and organizing your own.

We hope that you will continue to support our work, and together, we will continue to provide more and more people in Ukraine with much-needed help during the most tragic time in the modern history of our country.

### TRACK RECORD IN 2022-2023

Since 2007 when Ukraine Charity was established in London our primary focus has been on helping orphans and underprivileged children and young adults in Ukraine.


However, since 24 February 2022 given the acute humanitarian crisis created by the Russian invasion, Ukraine Charity also concentrated on emergency medical and humanitarian supplies for Ukrainian hospitals and communities.

Starting from February 2022 Ukraine Charity has started to fundraise and receive large volumes of donations and grants from various sources.


Starting from February 2022 Ukraine Charity has managed to raise more than £2.3 m.

Our main source of income are donations via fundraising platforms, followed by direct donations to bank account and grants.

### CHARITY PROJECT FINANCING




- Ambulances and evacuation vehicles
- Youth and child support and development
- Humanitarian relief

During the same period Ukraine Charity allocated for various charity projects £2.15 m.

64% of funds were allocated to medical supplies and equipment, 15% for ambulances and evacuation vehicles as well as for humanitarian relief and 5% on youth and children support and development.

Administrative expenses remain very low, since February 2022 only £21K were spent for admin expenses, which comprises around 0.5% of charity income.



Since 24 February 2022 given the acute humanitarian crisis created by the Russian invasion, Ukraine Charity concentrated on emergency medical and humanitarian supplies for Ukrainian hospitals and communities.

Though, we remain committed to support orphans and underprivileged children and young adults in Ukraine.

We continue to strive to finance high-impact targeted projects and on the same time ensure our overhead expenses are minimal.





### EUROPEAN BANK OF RECONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT (EBRD) COMMUNITY INITIATIVE



Ukraine Charity is honored to be one of the first charities to have received support from fundraisers that were initiated by our friends and long-term volunteers working for EBRD, and especially a matching donation from EBRD Community Initiative, in the total amount of around £395k. Funds that were thus raised were used to purchase vitally needed medical equipment and supplies to help the wounded and the traumatized in Ukraine,

including tourniquets, Celox, first aid kits,

ultrasound devices and trainings for doctors working in the area of mental health. The recipients of such medical equipment and supplies include the Ukrainian Medical Association of the United Kingdom, the I. Horbachevsky Ternopil National University, the Ministry of Health of Ukraine, Plast, Smart Medical Aid Foundation.









### **HOSPITALLERS**

Hospitallers is a civilian force of paramedics founded in 2014 by medical volunteer Yana Zinkevych. Since then and until now Hospitallers are operating in Ukrainian war zones «for the sake of every life», as per their motto.

Right on the battlefields, Hospitallers are first to help the wounded: provide first medical aid and


evacuate to the hospital. They also give posthospital support and rehabilitation to people affected by military actions and their families. As of today, medical crews have already completed more than 3000 evacuations. Hospitallers is a non-state organization which means that their collaboration with volunteers and donations is the only support they receive.







Hospitallers were one of the main fundraisers as well as the biggest recipient of the donations from Ukraine Charity since full scale Russian invasion in Ukraine started. Ukraine Charity purchased various medical supplies and equipment (including first aid kits, first aid bandages, tourniquets etc.) totaling £483k as well as 14 ambulances and 24 evacuation vehicles totaling £294k.





### SMART MEDICAL AID

Over the last year Ukraine Charity has realized and supported a number of charitable projects in partnership with the Netherlands & Ukraine registered charity Smart Medical Aid founded by NHS consultant Dr. Iryna Rybinkina.

The charity is focused on providing medical relief for people in Ukraine, which has been dramatically increased by the war. The projects include:

Purchasing and delivering of neonatal ambulance and baby pod for communal non-commercial enterprise of the Sumy Regional Council «Regional Children's Clinical Hospital». EUR38,8K.

The structured series of training events for the populations in order to raise awareness, knowledge and competency in basic life saver maneuvers. The use of different strategies allows the enrollment of





different segments of the population, increasing the penetration of the provided knowledge. Parallel to events for the general population, SMART Medical Aid also installed automatic external defibrillators (AEDs) in strategic locations in Ivano-Frankivsk and Lutsk. (cant find the amount for Lutsk +Ivano-Frankivsk!)

In March 2023 Ukraine Charity together with Smart Medical Aid organized a black -tie fundraiser in London in order to raise funds for building «Healing garden» in Dnipro Childrens Hospital. 46k have been raised and donated towards the project.



# CITY OF GOODNESS ('Misto Dobra')



It is an outstanding place in Chernivtsi, first place created in Ukraine to help really disadvantaged people in the society, mothers and children, who often experience abuse and different unfortunate circumstances in their lives to stay together. Since the beginning of the full scale invasion, the center also accepts women with children and elderly people from all over the country.


Without any restrictions they accept families with pets, settle them, feed them, provide medical



treatment and try to make this time at least a little less traumatic for the little ones. They have also taken in 3 evacuee orphanages from the South of Ukraine. These are the children from birth to 7 years of age.

Over the last year Ukraine Charity helped to purchase a minibus which expands their ability to deliver goods and food to hard to reach places. £16,5K.

The charity also sponsored the building of the very first modern outdoor sports complex for children age 4 to 15 years old, which has been installed in the City of Goodness becoming an important element of the entire physical and mental development system and support for children living in the shelter. £22,5K.

# AMBULANCES AND EVACUATION VEHICLES



Since February 2022 in total Ukraine Charity financed purchase of more than 40 ambulances and evacuation vehicles. The vehicles were delivered to various partners in Ukraine including Hospitallers, Smart Medical Aid, hospitals in Odesa and many more.



#### **FEATURED PROJECT**

Ukraine Charity together with LUkraine ASBL, our partners in Luxembourg, supported the purchase of the evacuation bus from Venari Group (including modification and refitting) for the total amount of EUR 54k which will be used to evacuate people from the front line areas of Ukraine to safer locations and to provide vital first aid. Ukraine Charity also supported, in partnership with LUkraine ASBL, the purchase from Venari Group of the armored evacuation vehicle for the Donetsk Region Emergency Service for the total amount of £38k.

# MEDICAL SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT

In the face of challenging times and heightened healthcare needs, Ukraine Charity has emerged as a beacon of hope, dedicating its efforts to alleviate the strain on medical facilities nationwide. Ukraine Charity has been instrumental in providing critical medical equipment assistance. This initiative spans various essential supplies and devices, reinforcing the healthcare infrastructure and ensuring that those in need receive timely and effective care.





#### ASSISTANCE PROVIDED:

- Funding of £21k to purchase ATOM electrosurgical apparatus for Kyiv City Children's Clinical Hospital 1 through partner «Zaporuka.»
- Procurement of 845 first-aid bandages, Celox, and 150 medical kits in collaboration with the Ukrainian Medical Association to benefit medical facilities.
- Provision of EUR 45k to acquire 1,000 individual first aid kits for SE "Medical Procurement of Ukraine» under the Ministry of Health.
- Financial support of EUR 8.9k for purchasing essential medical equipment (meshes and steriliser) for skin restoration in collaboration with partner CF «Treasury of Hope.»
- Collaboration with Anna Shevchenko for purchasing and supplying 500 units of special

first aid bandages (Celox Hemostatic) to hospitals in Ukraine, totalling £16.75k.

- Joint effort with «People of the Future» foundation for a £23k investment in medical equipment for a hospital near the front line.
- Financing the acquisition of AIRVO2 High Flow Nasal Cannula (HFNC) for the pediatric intensive care unit of Kyiv City Children's Clinical Hospital 1.
- Acquisition of negative pressure wound therapy (NPWT) equipment and consumables for Kyiv and Zaporizhzhia hospitals, totalling EUR 81k.
- Financing disposables/replacement supplies for SAM12 units (medical and surgical suction machines) in Ukrainian hospitals through a partnership with Kent for Ukraine partners.
- Support the «Other\_fund» project, contributing £9k to facilitate physiotherapy for Ukrainian soldiers with the Gymna ShockMaster 300 portable shockwave therapy device.




# AND DISPLACED PERSONS

# REFUGEES AND INTERNALLY DISPLACED PERSONS

In the relentless aftermath of conflicts and forced displacements, the plight of refugees and internally displaced persons (IDPs) is a stark reality that demands urgent attention and compassionate intervention. The Ukraine Charity, recognising the immense challenges faced by these vulnerable populations, has extended its commitment to humanitarian causes by actively

supporting projects aimed at providing refuge, sustenance, and essential services to those uprooted from their homes. Through strategic partnerships and targeted funding, the charity endeavours to make a meaningful difference in the lives of refugees and IDPs, offering them a glimpse of hope and a pathway towards rebuilding their futures.



## UKRAINE CHARITY SUPPORTS 'THROUGH THE WAR' IN KHARKIV: BUILDING A BETTER FUTURE

In March 2022, the public organisation 'Through the War' initiated a noble project in Kharkiv to provide shelter and care for elderly individuals displaced by armed aggression. Ukraine Charity proudly supported this endeavour, contributing £13k to enhance living conditions. Renovations included refurbishing rooms, constructing a covered terrace, and installing autonomous charging stations, creating a haven for over 50 elderly guests.

#### UKRAINE CHARITY SUPPORTS 'WE ARE CLOSE' CRISIS CENTRE IN VINNYTSIA

Since January 2021, the crisis centre in Vinnytsia has been a sanctuary for mothers with children and pregnant women facing difficulties. Ukraine Charity supported the centre by providing financial assistance for essential food supplies and covering medical expenses for approximately 25 individuals seeking refuge and support.





#### SUPPORT FOR TEMPORARY REPLACED CHILDREN BY NGO TVOYA BRAMA

Ukraine Charity financed the purchase of necessary furniture and essential supplies for children temporarily placed in a sanatorium in the Kyiv region, under the care of NGO Tvoya Brama.

#### TEMPORARY HOUSING FOR REFUGEES IN LVIV HOSTEL WITH 'TURBOTA V DII'

In partnership with 'Turbota v dii,' Ukraine Charity funded housing for 24 refugees, predominantly women with children, in the «Lviv Euro Hostel.» Beyond accommodation, the initiative covered necessities like food, toiletries, medicine, and clothing for the relocated families.



#### NAZARET REHABILITATION CENTRE IN ZAKARPATTYA REGION

Ukraine Charity supported the Nazaret Rehabilitation Center in the Zakarpattya region, providing additional beds, supplies, and fuel to assist Ukrainian refugees fleeing from the war initiated by Russia.

### BUS AND PATROL FOR UKRAINIAN REFUGEES IN THE UK

Funding bus trips and patrols for Ukrainian refugees, particularly mothers with children, currently in the UK, Ukraine Charity facilitated four trips across south England, ensuring their safe transport and support.

#### SCHOOL CAMP FOR REFUGEE KIDS "KAMYANYATSYA. FREE" IN IVANO-FRANKIVSK

Collaborating with Mercy Corps Global, Ukraine Charity co-financed a school camp for refugee kids in Ivano-Frankivsk. The project aimed to provide a supportive environment for children displaced from Eastern Ukraine, offering them opportunities for growth and development.

#### SUPPORT FOR NGO YES: SEASONAL FOOTWEAR PROJECT

Collaborating with NGO YES, Ukraine Charity facilitated a project providing seasonal footwear for children from internally displaced families. Financial assistance of UAH 1200 per child was provided to 181 beneficiaries, supporting families in Zaporizhzhia and the surrounding region.

# FEATURED PROJECT: NGO "PODOLIAN AGENCY FOR REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT" IN VINNYTSIA

In response to the displacement of 960 mothers and children in Vinnytsia, Ukraine Charity financed a project to establish a vegetable processing centre. The initiative involved purchasing equipment such as professional vegetable cutters and washing machines, ensuring food for the displaced individuals living in shelters.

# SUPPORT FOR ST MARY'S SCHOOL IN LONDON: UKRAINIAN-LANGUAGE EDUCATION

Ukraine Charity supported St Mary's School in London to provide Ukrainian-language education for refugee children in the UK. The project included funding Easter and May half-term educational camps and providing school furniture and stationery.





## PROJECT VOICES OF CHILDREN: BACK-TO-SCHOOL BACKPACKS

In collaboration with Igor & Marketa Makar, Ukraine Charity matched a grant of £1,500 to fund back-to-school backpacks and supplies for 66 internally displaced children. In total, 350 children were equipped for the school year.

# CHILDREN AND YOUTH SUPPORT AND DEVELOPMENT

In the pursuit of fostering a brighter future for the younger generation, Ukraine Charity places a special emphasis on children's and youth support and development. Recognising the unique challenges faced by children affected by war, orphans transitioning to adult life, and those in need of psychological support, the charity has strategically financed projects that encompass education, recreation, and overall well-being.

#### FASTIV TRAINING AND REHABILITATION CENTRE: INTERACTIVE LEARNING AND COMFORTABLE SEATING

Ukraine Charity, in collaboration with fundraising partner 'Be Kind' and charity partner TulSun Foundation, financed the purchase of an interactive floor and positional chairs for the Fastiv Training and Rehabilitation Centre. This £11.7K project aimed to create an engaging and comfortable environment for the children, enhancing their learning and rehabilitation experiences.





#### CHILD SUPPORT AND HUMANITARIAN AID IN ZAPORIZHZHIA VILLAGES WITH KOZAK MAMAI

Together with Kozak Mamai, Ukraine Charity funded child support initiatives in villages in the Zaporizhzhia region. This included the purchase of sports uniforms, providing stationary presents for children, and ensuring access to generators and lamps, addressing both recreational and practical needs.

#### SUPPORT FOR ORPHANAGE GRADUATES: TRANSITION TO ADULT LIFE

Recognizing the challenges faced by 16-18 year old teenagers transitioning from orphanages to adult life, Ukraine Charity financed activities by partner Detdom.info. The support focused on practical assistance for orphanage graduates, aiding them in finding jobs, securing housing, managing budgets, accessing medical services, and navigating day-to-day challenges.

### AUTUMN CAMP FOR CHILDREN AFFECTED BY WAR

Ukraine Charity, in collaboration with 'Be Kind' and the 'Association of incoming tour operators of Ukraine,' financed an autumn camp for 45 children affected by the war. The camp provided a range of activities and excursions, offering a respite for children who have become internally displaced persons (IDPs), children of military personnel, and those from families facing difficult circumstances.



## WOMAN AND WAR CHARITY: PSYCHOLOGICAL SUPPORT FOR WOMEN AND CHILDREN

Collaborating with the Woman and War charity, Ukraine Charity provided funding for the creation of a website and ongoing operational costs. This charity focuses on offering crucial psychological support for women and children of Ukraine, including vulnerable teens, widows, and those who lost children due to the war.

#### OSTRIV DYTYNSTVA: ART CAMP FOR SPECIAL BOARDING SCHOOL PUPILS

Ukraine Charity supported the creative camp «Art Camp. Bakota-2022» organized by NGO «Centre for Culture and Arts 'Island of Children'» for pupils and teachers of Mykolaiv special boarding school N.2. The initiative covered accommodation and meals for 64 children, teachers, and camp staff, providing a unique artistic experience.



#### GIFT CERTIFICATES FOR ORPHANED CHILDREN WITH CO CF TAPS

In partnership with CO CF TAPS, Ukraine Charity purchased gift certificates for creativity and stationery for children who have lost parents in the war. This initiative aims to bring joy and creative outlets to these young individuals facing challenging circumstances.



#### SUPPORT FOR PARA SWIMMING AND PARA TRIATHLON SCHOOL OF KYIV REGION

Ukraine Charity supported the para swimming and para triathlon school of Kyiv Region (state school 'Invasport'), financing essential clothing, equipment, and sports nutrition for 25 athletes aged 6-18 years old, as well as 5 young athletes aged 18+. This initiative promotes inclusivity and supports the athletic development of para athletes.



### **HUMANITARIAN RELIEF**

Ukraine Charity, deeply attuned to the urgent needs of communities affected by war, has steadfastly committed to providing essential aid and support through a spectrum of projects. This section illuminates the diverse initiatives undertaken by Ukraine Charity under the umbrella of humanitarian relief, each designed to

address specific challenges faced by individuals and communities in the wake of the Russian invasion. These projects span from supplying critical resources and medical assistance to offering psychological support, reflecting a holistic approach to alleviating the multifaceted burdens borne by those affected.

#### SOBORNIST UKRAINY: HEATING AND ESSENTIAL AID FOR FRONT-LINE COMMUNITIES

Ukraine Charity collaborated with Sobornist Ukrainy, a registered charity based in Zaporizhzhia, to bring warmth and essential aid to front-line communities. Recognising the challenges faced by those in constant shelling, Ukraine Charity provided 16 portable heaters and five generators, offering warmth and the means for necessities in areas deprived of essential utilities.



#### LORRIES OF HUMANITARIAN HELP TO VARIOUS ORGANIZATIONS

Ukraine Charity financed the haulage of seven lorries carrying humanitarian help to three organizations: the international center of support of women and children 'Misto Dobra' in Chernivtsi, Ukraine; Fedratsia Karate (Karate Federation) in Lviv, Ukraine; and Dopomoga Armii in Rivne, Ukraine. The total budget for this project was £17.7K.



## MEDICAL RESOURCES AND SUPPORT FOR VULNERABLE POPULATIONS

Ukraine Charity supplied much-needed medical resources through this initiative, including first-aid kits, medical supplies, rehabilitation equipment, and essential items like diapers. The total budget for this comprehensive project, addressing the diverse needs of vulnerable populations, amounted to £16.8K.

#### POSLANETS MYRU: FOOD AND HYGIENE SUPPLIES FOR DISADVANTAGED PEOPLE IN KYIV

Ukraine Charity, in collaboration with Poslanets Myru, purchased and delivered food supplies and hygiene products for disadvantaged people in Kyiv affected by a lack of income and support due to the Russian invasion.

#### KORPORACIA MONSTRIV: HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE FOR CIVILIANS

Korporacia Monstriv provided humanitarian assistance to vulnerable civilians, particularly single mothers, elderly individuals, bedridden and disabled children. The initiative focused on supplying food, baby food, diapers, medicines, and hygiene items to those on the verge of survival amid the Russian military invasion.





#### HUMANITARIAN HELP FOR SOUTHERN UKRAINE WITH INTERNATIONAL VOLUNTEER CENTER "4UA"

Ukraine Charity financed humanitarian aid for the Southern Ukraine region, collaborating with the International Volunteer Center "4UA" under the auspices of Regional Association of Territorial Communities (RATEG). This initiative aimed to alleviate the immediate impact of Russian aggression in Mykolaiv Oblast and the liberated part of Kherson Oblast.





# TRAINING FOR UKRAINIAN DOCTORS BY PRIMO LEVI CENTRE AND YALE SCHOOL OF PUBLIC HEALTH

Ukraine Charity provided EUR 10.6K to fund training organized by Primo Levi Centre and the Yale School of Public Health for 14 Ukrainian doctors. This initiative aimed to enhance the psychological support provided to people of Ukraine afflicted by war trauma, displacement, and political persecution.

## PSYCHOLOGICAL HELP FOR FAMILIES AND CHILDREN AFFECTED BY WAR

Ukraine Charity extended support by financing psychological help for families and children affected by the war. Qualified specialists, operating under the auspices of the Institute of Health Psychology (www.psyaid. center), provided crucial psychological support to those grappling with the traumatic impact of conflict.

# GENERATOR FOR WATER SUPPLY NEAR IZIUM WITH ALL UKRAINIAN LEAGUE OF UKRAINIAN WOMEN

Collaborating with All Ukrainian League of Ukrainian Women (ALUW) and the Association of Ukrainian Women in Great Britain (AUW), Ukraine Charity funded the purchase of an 18 kW generator to provide water for 1,200 people near Izium. This project also included two 12.5 kW generators for pumping stations and a second-hand people carrier for humanitarian supply delivery and evacuations.



#### SUPPORT FOR GO «PROLISKA» PROJECT: CRUCIAL HUMANITARIAN AID ACROSS UKRAINE

Ukraine Charity supported the GO «Proliska» project, contributing to the provision of crucial humanitarian aid in various regions across Ukraine, including cities such as Kharkiv, Poltava, Sumy, Zaporizhzhia, Vinnytsia, Dnipro, Ternopil, Khmelnytskyi, and their respective regions.
